The principal city and the capital is Warsaw.




POPULATION

The city history begins at the end the XIII sec. At the time Warsaw was a village of fisher. In 1569 becomes the capital city of Poland. It was one of the greatest cities in the world until the second war world when 85% of its building was disrupted.


Then the city has been rebuilt and in 1980 it becomes UNESCO's World Heritage List.

Nicolò Copernico, astronomer and mathematician graduated from the University of Ferrara in 1503 and founder of the modern astronomy;

Roman Polansky, award-winning director of various awards including the 2003 Oscar for the film "The Pianist", Golden Globe in 1975 for the film "Chinatown" and in 1981 for the best foreign film with "Tess";

Robert Lewandowski, soccer player, he plays in Germany in the Munich Bayern and Polish National team. He is the strongest Polish striker in the World. Salary: 15 million a year.

Is a city in western Poland and the lagest city in the historical region of Silesia. It lies on the banks of the River Oder in the Silesian Lowlands of Central Europe, roughly 350 kilometres (220 mi) from the Baltic Sea to the north and 40 kilometres (25 mi) from the Sudeten Mountains to the south.
